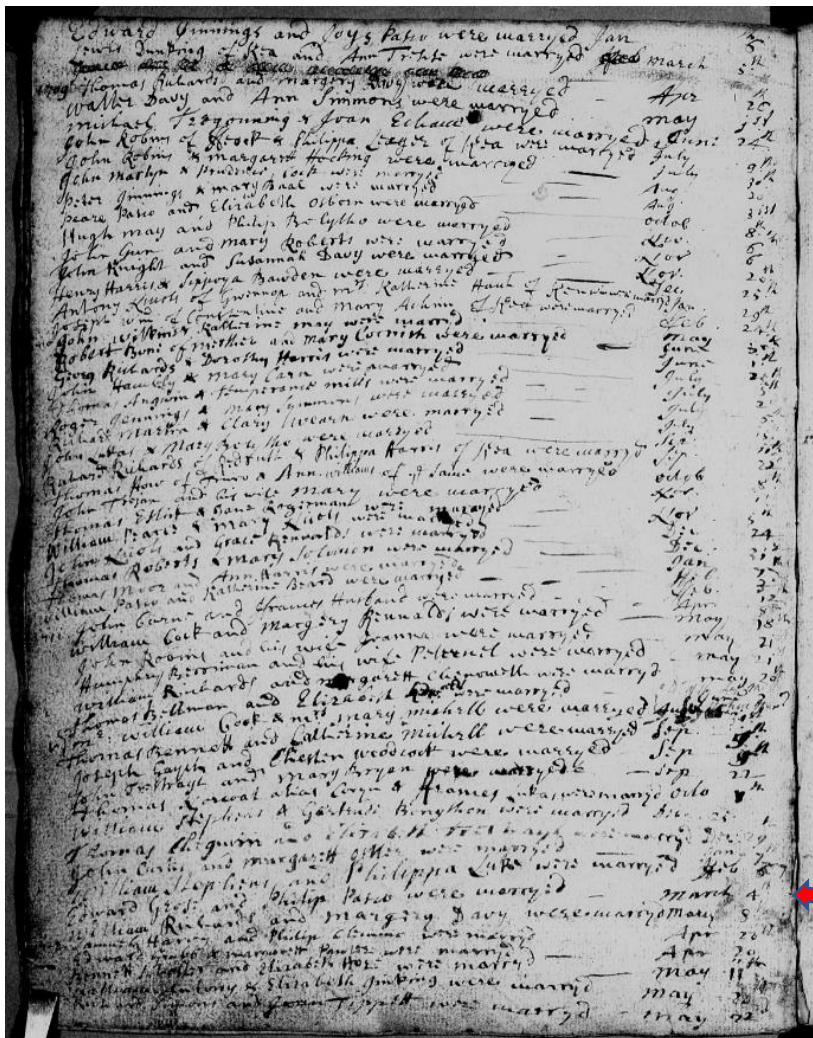

Edward Grose was born in Cornwall in 1688, I do not have a record of his baptism, but it is likely to have been in Gwennap. I do not have a record of his parents, but a baptism record shows his father was Edward Grose.

There is reference that an Edward Grose was mayor of Truro in 1674. This could have been the father of this Edward Grose. I have been unable to confirm this fact.

Edward Grose married Phillippa Pasco at Kenwyn Church, Truro, on 4th March, 1711.

The following information has been copied from the work of a family historian.

GROSE: an (c)grows, the cross (c mutates to g). GROSE was a name well known in the county in the 16th & 17th centuries. The family of Grose or Grosse hailed originally from Liskeard, but resided afterwards at Camborne and Budock, where they flourished for five generations. Ezekial Grosse, gent, of Trelodevus, Camborne, bought the manor of Rosemodres in the reign of Elizabeth for 700 pounds. Ezekial Grosse, attorney-at-law, of Golden, Camborne, and of Rosewarne, in the reign of Charles I, was a comissioner for the county in Cromwell's time. Edward Grose was mayor of Truro in 1674. Grose is also an old Bodmin name, the earliest form being Le Gros, which was the name of one of the burgesses for the borough in parliament in the reign of Edward I (1272-1309).
