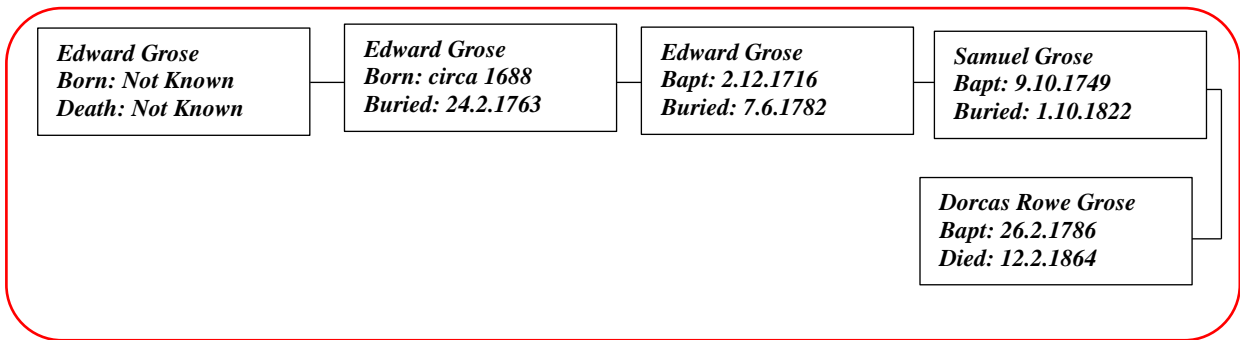

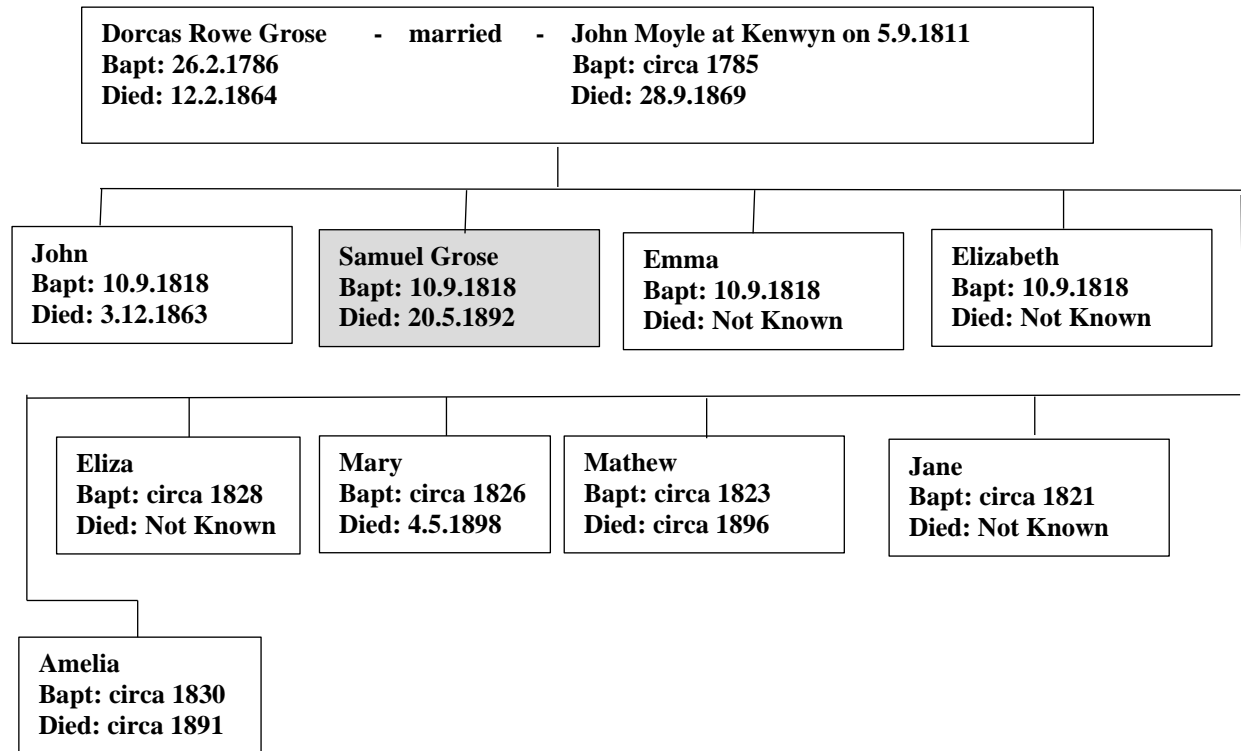

The 1841 census was the first modern census, when the first Registrar General of England and Wales was made responsible for organising the count.

The 1841 census was taken on the night of 6 June 1841 and gave the total population as 18,553,124.

The task of counting was passed to local officers of the newly created registration service. This is the earliest census that has survived in its entirety: few of the 1801, 1811, 1821 and 1831 censuses have survived the ravages of time.

1841 was the first time that the head of each household was given a form to fill in on behalf of everyone in the dwelling on a set day. This system still forms the basis of the method used today.

Note: In the 1841 Census a policy of rounding down ages was in place. As such, people aged:  
 15-19 were recorded as 15  
 20-24 were recorded as 20  
 25-29 were recorded as 25  
 30-34 were recorded as 30  
 35-39 were recorded as 35...and so on

When the 1851 census was taken on 30 March total population was recorded as 17,922,768.

The original documents would have been given to the householder several days before the March 30th date, and the head of household would have been asked to fill in the details for anyone who would have been residing at that address on the census date.

Of course, illiteracy was high in 1851, and anyone unable to read or write would have made use of an enumerator - a literate person who would be collecting the census forms - to help fill in the details. Because of this, however, it will be noted that mistakes were made, such as name spellings. It should also be noted that many people were often economical with the truth when it came to their ages.

Note: the census includes details of people resident in docked vessels and institutions such as prisons, workhouses, hospitals, and barracks, as well as individual households.

The 1861 England, Wales & Scotland Census was taken on the night of 7 April 1861 and gave the total population as 23,085,579.

If you inexplicably can't find a male ancestor, who's over the age of 14 and who you know should be in the census, then the best place to start looking is the 1861 World Wide Army Index. An incredibly valuable census substitute, this resource gives the names of 245,000 serving soldiers, not just those who were posted in Britain but also those who found themselves in the further reaches of Queen Victoria's Empire. Many of the men who don't show up in the census would have been away when it was being taken because they were serving in the army or navy.

However the census does include details of people resident in docked vessels and institutions such as prisons, workhouses, hospitals, and barracks.

When the 1871 census was taken on the night of 2 April 1871 the total population was recorded as 26,072,036.

For the first time, the General Register Office attempted to co-ordinate taking a census across all the colonies and dependencies in the British Empire. The results found that there were 234,762,593 people in the British Empire.

The original documents would have been given to householders several days before 2 April, and the head of household would have been asked to fill in the details for anyone who would have been residing at that address on the census date. If the head of the household was unable to read or write, the enumerator - a literate person who would be collecting the census forms - would help fill in the details. Because of this, however, it will be noted that mistakes were made, such as name spellings. It should also be noted that many people were often economical with the truth when it came to their ages.

Note: the census includes details of people resident in docked vessels and institutions such as prisons, workhouses, hospitals, and barracks, as well as individual households.

**CHACEWATER** is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1837 from the parishes of Kenwyn and Kea. The township of CHACEWATER is in the parish of Kenwyn, with the exception of a few dwellings at the east end, which are situated in the parish of Kea; it is 5 miles west from Truro, and 4 east from Redruth, in the Western division of the county, west division of Powder hundred, Truro union and county court district, rural deanery of Powder, archdeaconry of Cornwall, and diocese of Exeter, and has a station on the West Cornwall railway, which is situated about half a mile from the township. The church of St. Paul is seated on an elevation, and consists of a chancel, nave, aisles, and tower containing 1 bell. The register dates from the year 1837. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £280, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Kenwyn, and held by the Rev. George Lemon Church, B.A., of St. John's College, Cambridge. There is a National school for boys and girls; a Sunday school is held at the school-room. An annual fair is held here on June 24th, and

a weekly market on Saturdays. The principal landowners are Viscount Falmouth, and Lords Clinton and Robartes. The population in 1871 was 3,648.

When the 1891 census was taken on April 5th, the total population of England, Wales and Scotland was recorded as 33,015,701.

In this census householders were asked how many rooms (if less than five) their family occupied, and additional occupation information was also taken. The original documents would have been given to householders several days before 5 April, and the head of household would have been asked to fill in the details for anyone who would have been residing at that address on the census date. If the head of the household was unable to read or write, the enumerator - a literate person who would be collecting the census forms - would help fill in the details. Because of this, however, it will be noted that mistakes were made, such as name spellings. It should also be noted that many people were often economical with the truth when it came to their ages.

Note: the census includes details of people resident in docked vessels and institutions such as prisons, workhouses, hospitals, and barracks, as well as individual households.
